p.7, Table of Contents, left column, bottom of page: Floridian is misspelled (as Floridan)

p.26, right column, second paragraph, reference to Royal Palm and New Royal Palm: During the winter season months of 1950 through 1955, the winter-season-only New Royal Palm was operated with lightweight equipment, while Royal Palm ran with conventional cars. In the spring through autumn months when New Royal Palm was not operating, its equipment was transferred to Royal Palm, making the latter a temporary streamliner. After New Royal Palm was withdrawn for good in April 1955, a number of its lightweight cars were permanently reassigned to Royal Palm.

**p.77 photo caption**: Tullahoma is spelled wrong (as *Tullahomma*).

**p.381, shaded box:** Heavyweight 6-4-4 *Fir*-series sleepers are confused with the lightweight 29 *Pine*-series 6-6-4 ordered for L&N, NC&STL, and C&EI in 1953. Those on *The Southland* in 1955 were *Fir*, not the streamlined *Pine* sleepers. The difference was in the number of Roomettes.

**p.428 bottom photo:** The train shown is *The Southland,* not the *South Wind,* which did not go through Knoxville.
