ANNUAL MEETING WRAP UP:

Brief Summary of 2016 PRRT&HS Annual Meeting

The 2016 Annual Meeting, hosted by the New England Chapter at the Radisson Harrisburg, May 19-21, featured a few new dimensions, as well as many excellent traditions, not the least of which was the opportunity to join with those of similar interests and passion for the PRR. Among the new dimensions were

- A panel of former PRR employees who shared anecdotes from their years on the PRR.
- The vendor room at the Radisson Harrisburg being open on Thursday evening.
- A re-designed raffle, modeled after some at railroad prototype modelers meets, which led to an expedited after-banquet program.

The T1 Trust brought a newly cast driver center for a PRR T1. Joe Acri organized a series of meetings for modelers at the Pennsylvania State Archives.

In all, 349 PRR T&HS members attended plus 95 family members.
