Our recent cold snap has taken its toll on a lot of people throughout Eastern U.S., the station was no exception. Pipes froze and broke in the bunkhouse resulting in major damage to the building. Water flooded the upstairs soaking the carpets and then seeped through the floor to the basement where the ceiling tiles and insulation became saturated falling on stored financial records and other papers.

Gary Hoy was able to round up a crew of men to help with the cleanup and assist the insurance company contractors. All carpeting will be replaced along with mold treatment. Scaffolding was constructed in the main waiting room of the station to dry out the records and other papers. The furnace, heating lines and water pipes were repaired. The fire and burglar alarm systems were unaffected.

AED Device Awarded

The PRRT&HS has been awarded an AED for the Lewistown train station for the public, our archive, and station use. FAME ambulance service coordinator Mick Asbrashoff, and Lewistown Mayor Debbie Bargo nominated the Lewistown station for the AED from the Lewistown Rotary Club. This was awarded on December 19, 2017 at a meeting of the Rotary Club. The Rotary club sponsored a golf tournament to raise the money for 3 AEDs in the local Lewistown area distributed among our station, Office of the Aging, and the Boy Scout Council.

Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) can save 75% of people that are defibrillated within 1 minute of the onset of a heart attack. One other important fact is 60% of people that have shockable rhythms survive.

Accepting the AED for the society is PRRT&HS VP and station manager Rich Ader.

This trip will be restricted to 250 passengers and will be available thanks to the generosity of Bennett Levin and his equipment. More information will be available soon.


