Station and Archive

A cold snap took its toll on a lot of people throughout Eastern U.S., the station was no exception. Pipes froze and broke in the bunkhouse resulting in major damage to the building. Water flooded the upstairs soaking the carpets and then seeped through the floor to the basement where the ceiling tiles and insulation became saturated falling on stored financial records and other papers. Gary Hoy was able to round up a crew of men to help with the cleanup and assist the insurance company contractors. All carpeting will be replaced along with mold treatment. Scaffolding was constructed in the main waiting room of the station to dry out the records and other papers. There were 2 breaks in the water pipes under the kitchen above the valves (luckily). After thawing another break was found in the heating line. The furnace is/was functioning properly suggesting the line froze on an exterior wall between cycles. The extent of the damage was complete flooding of the bunkhouse floor, 4 breaks of pipes, the basement sustained moderate damage with several ceiling tiles and insulation water logged and water damage to some of the old financial records and a 2015 accession. The accession was separated from the other accessions for space saving. The title blocks were cut off. It will be processed later for that reason.

Drying racks were constructed in the main room of the station and used for drying, at the direction of the adjuster. Some drawings were taken home by Al Giannantonio to dry with the adjuster's approval. The walls of the bunkhouse were not damaged from the water but have been treated for mold. All cabinets, vanity, subfloor, carpeting and vinyl will be placed with new as needed, along with all piping. The drying racks will be stored in container #2. Awaiting final word from the claims adjuster.

An A.E.D was donated to the PRRT&HS for mounting in the station. The Lewistown Rotary Club purchased three A.E.D. units for the community. Thanks to Mayor Deborah Bargo, the PRRT&HS was chosen.



FEATURE PRESENTATION: "A Century of Catenary" Presented by Frank Tatnall Adapted from Frank's article in the fall 2015 issue of "Classic Trains" magazine. It commemorates the 100th anniversary of the start of electric operations on the Paoli Local, with the first revenue trip under catenary occurring September 11, 1915. The 20-miles to Paoli were the test bed for PRR's early experiments with 11,000-volt AC operation, the success of which gave Pennsy the confidence to electrify much of its heavily-trafficked railroad east of Harrisburg, including the Northeast Corridor.
