The PRRT&HS Paint Committee is happy to report that the equipment on display in the courtyard of the Altoona Railroaders Memorial Museum is being repainted using formulas developed by the paint committee and will be re-lettered using accurate lettering provided by Mount Vernon Shops/John Frantz. The Railway Express X29 has been repainted into 1940's Freight Car Color, with preparations being made to repaint the N5 into the same shade of Freight Car Color soon as well. The former Railway Express X29 will be re-lettered into a "Circle Keystone" scheme and the N5 will be re-lettered into the "Circle Keystone" scheme including the "Buy War Bonds" slogan. The YB Scale Test Car, R50b Express Reefer, and D70fr Diner will also be repainted and re-lettered in an accurate and appropriate scheme to be determined by the Chief Curator.





# NEW TWO-VOLUME BOOK SET NOW AVAILABLE THE TTX STORY




The Pennsylvania Railroad and Rail-Trailer Company formed Trailer Train Company in 1955 to expand piggyback service amongst the nation's railroads. The PRR initially managed TTX, which expanded its ownership to 41 railroads. The 62-year journey started with 500 flatcars in 1956 and grew to over 161,000 cars (TOFC, auto rack, Railbox, Railgon, and speciallu equipped) today.

The authors, James D. Panza, Richard W. Dawson and Ronald P. Sellberg, combined, have over 90 years of service with Trailer Train/TTX. They present much "insider" information on company decisions, car design, and the shift to container intermodal service. Presented in landscape format the two-volume book set is hardbound, all color, and together total 624 pages.
