Annual Meeting Highlights

2020 - May 13-16 -- State College, PA Sneak preview on trips:

1. May 14, 2020 Steel Mill and Station Tour

Both buses will leave Penn Stater ~8:15 am.

Bus 1 will proceed to the Standard Steel Mill and arrive ~9:00am for tour. (50 people max).

Bus 2 will proceed to the Lewistown Junction Station. Arrive ~9:00am. (50 people max)

Lunch will be from 11:15-12:15 at J.P. Edwards.

Bus 1 will then proceed to the Lewistown station. Arrive 12:30pm Bus 2 will then proceed to the Steel Mill. Arrive 12:30pm

2. May 15, 2020 Muleshoe Tour

The purpose of this tour is to expose participants to some lesser known aspects of the PRR in the Altoona area and to orient them so that they can spend more time on their own if desired. One important aspect is to visit the location of PRR's Mule Shoe Curve. Part of this story includes the Pennsylvania Canal and the Allegheny Portage RR, otherwise known as the Main Line of Public Works. These were purchased by the PRR and are part of the route followed by PRR's line through the Mule Shoe to the tunnels at Gallitzin, otherwise known as the "New Portage Secondary." We will stop at the Canal Basin in Hollidaysburg, where the PRR connected (1852) for about two years to take passengers over the mountain until the Allegheny Tunnel was completed in 1854. At the Portage RR Museum, you can get a better portion of the story for this route. Will stop at the Cresson Helper Servicing Facilities. The Cresson and Irvona Branches delivered much coal traffic to the Main Line here. In 1951 there were still 27 branches and branches of branches feeding coal to Cresson, which we will discuss. We will pass the locations of numerous towers at Wye, MO, UN, AR, Slope, Alto, Rose, and Antis as well as the PRR's Engine houses at Cresson and East Altoona and the Sam Rea Car Shops at Hollidaysburg. The car shops and AR are the only extant structures. The trip will take about 5 hours. A sandwich lunch will be included.



PITTSBURGH TO ERIE, ASHTABULA, CLEVELAND & MANSFIELD by David W. Messer



Continuing the rich tradition of his Triumph series books, celebrated author David W. Messer has teamed with the PRRT&HS to offer Conquest 1, documenting the history of the Pennsylvania Railroad's Lake Division physical plant. This includes the network of PRR lines radiating from Pittsburgh northwest to Erie, Ashtabula, Cleveland and Mansfield from 1848 to the present day.

Conquest 1, a 240-page hardbound book, contains 500 illustrations, many in color, and includes 12 large maps located in a rear pocket. Member price: \$65.00 plus shipping - PA residents add 6% sales tax.

Wilkinsburg Train Station Restoration Project



Built in 1915 by Philadelphia architect Walter H. Cookson, the station earned a spot on the National Register of Historic Places in 1985.

Vacant for more than 50 years, this Beaux Arts style building will become one of the most historically significant and architecturally unique buildings in the Pittsburgh area.

Its \$6.5 million renovation includes:

- Renovation of existing site amenities and landscape
- Comprehensive restoration of the building's exterior
- Restoration of significant historic spaces on the main floor
- Renovation of the lower level
- New restrooms
- New site utilities, including water, sewer, gas and electrical service
- New mechanical, electrical, plumbing and fire protection services (completed according to historic property standards)

The fully renovated building is expected to be move-in ready by early 2020.
