STATION AND ARCHIVE

Station:

Estimates were sought for repairs to the foundation wall (track side) of the station. It was noticed that the grouting between the rock seams was eroding, and also 2 vertical support beams were rotting. The cellar door to the outside (JVRR side) also has considerable rust and rot, and is difficult to open and close. Gary obtained estimates for both jobs.

On February 4, 2020 approval was given, via an email poll of directors (7 voting yes, 2 no response). I authorized Gary to contact the contractors: Knob View Construction, to make repairs to the door, and Allensville Planing Mill, to do the foundation and beam work. The work will consist of repointing the rock seams, and replacing 2, possibly 3, 16"x16" vertical support beams in the southwest corner of the basement. As work progresses, Gary will oversee the job and report progress to the station manager.

Negotiations are continueing between the PRRT&HS and Amtrak for the paving of the parking lot, and continued use of the waiting area. The paving of the parking lot is slated to be accomplished this spring when the weather breaks.

The Middle Division Chapter, has become their own independent non-profit organization. They are no longer affiliated with the PRRT&HS, and their members who work the Amtrak room have all been required to become PRRT&HS members in order to continue to work in the Amtrak room. The new identity of the group is: Lewistown Junction Railroad Society.

Archives:

Work continues on processing the many mechanical dept. drawings.

Volunteers, when available, have also been processing, photos, books, time tables (employee and public), misc. publications, val maps, and the sorting of non PRR materials and sending them off to other RR Societies or Historical Societies. Also we continue scanning materials when able, as man power allows.

The archives has received a total of 45 donations this year. Three of which were extremely large, consisting of more mechanical dept. drawings, most of which are original linen drawings. There were 96 boxes of drawings, mostly linens, transferred to the PRRTHS from the Smithsonian. Two other large donations (separate times) came from the Erie Lackawanna RRHS consisting mostly of val maps (Lines West), track maps and building locations in yards. (Mostly Ohio). We also received a large donation of public timetables, dating from the 1940's thru Penn Central, over 10,000. PRR, PRSL, LIRR, and Penn Central.

Another trip to the Tennessee Valley RR is in the works, as another large donation from the Southern RRHS is being put together. 2020 seems like another profitable year.

This is the breakdown of the archive volunteer staff compiled by Charlie Woodward, volunteer coordinator. There are a lot of people on the list, so be advised the average attendance is 6. We have had as many as 14 at any one time, and as few as 3. Of course, they attend as their time allows.


PORTABLE DISPLAY

- ... September 12, 2020: Railroad Heritage Day at the RRMPA, Strasburg, PA (Joe Acri)




