#### **BRUCE F. SMITH**

Bruce is an avid modeler and historian. Because of his interest in the history of World War II he models June, 1944. Bruce has Presented clinics at numerous prototype modelers meets and published a number of articles on modeling. He has served as Vice President and President of the PRRT&HS as well as on the Long-Range Planning, Paint and Modeling committees of the PRRT&HS. He is currently chair of the PRRT&HS Paint Committee.
